Still I Rise: Addressing the State of Black Women and Girls

The Jewel Plummer Cobb Sisters Conference is a biennial event presenting relevant and important topics which shape how we live, learn and thrive in a complex world together with those who understand and resonate with our shared struggles and achievements. Hosted by the Black Alumnae Network (BAN) of the Associate Alumnae of Douglass College (AADC), this unique conference was inspired by the prolific life of Jewel Plummer Cobb, who, among her many amazing accomplishments, was the first Black Dean of Douglass College. This year, we will explore two underlying issues that continue to impact the security of Black women and girls: technology and employment. Through powerful panel discussions and expert insights, we will consider what we need to prepare for the future and move together beyond conversation to share valuable resources and develop a collective call to action. With 200 members of our community expected to attend, this event will feature panels on artificial intelligence's impact on Black communities and an economic action plan for Black women and our communities, respectively, along with breakfast, lunch, and networking receptions.

The Black Alumnae Network of the Associate Alumnae of Douglass College (AADC) was established in 1981 to organize events that are of particular interest to African American alumnae. The AADC is an independent, self-supporting 501(c)(3) organization, with a mission to develop and promote connections among Douglass alumnae by providing programs, services, networks and lifelong learning opportunities that represent the interests and needs of our diverse alumnae.
